
E-newsletter: Our monthly e-newsletter delivers cooperative news and helpful tips straight to your

MESSAGE FROM MEMBER SERVICES: Director nomination details

As we begin to prepare for Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative's annual meeting in June, we have begun to seek director nominations. Our board of directors leads our cooperative with passion and forward thinking to ensure the longevity of Mor-Gran-Sou Electric. If you are interested in running for a director position, learn more below!

Director elections

The initial commitment is a three-year term, with provisions in the bylaws limiting a director to serving six consecutive three-year terms, after which time the director is not eligible for another six consecutive three-year terms until one year has elapsed.

At the annual meeting on June 11 the following three board positions will be elected:

- **Grant County** – currently held by Casey Wells (serving his sixth and final three-year term)
- **Mandan Area** – currently held by Robert Leingang (serving his sixth and final three-year term)
- **Sioux County** – currently held by Rodney Froelich (serving his second three-year term)

Under the bylaws and due to a mail-in ballot, no nominations are accepted from the floor at the annual meeting. Instead, the bylaws require the board of directors to appoint a Nominating Committee of five to nine members who geographically represent the cooperative. These members will provide a list of qualified and willing candidates to the board for approval and inclusion on the ballot at the board of directors' meeting scheduled for Feb. 25. This date has been set so there is adequate time for each candidate's biographical information to be included with the notice of meeting sent to the members in May, along with the mail-in ballot for those who are unable to attend the annual meeting in person.


Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee, which is appointed by Mor-Gran-Sou Electric's directors, met for the first time Dec. 15, 2025. The committee will meet for a final time at 6:30 p.m. CT on Feb. 19.

For a person to be nominated, the member running for a board seat must submit the completed

declaration of candidacy form to Mor-Gran-Sou Electric by 4 p.m. CT on Feb. 12. All qualified and willing candidates who have completed and forwarded the written declaration of candidacy form to the Mor-Gran-Sou Electric office by the Feb. 12 deadline will be included in the list the Nominating Committee will provide to the board.

Bylaws and resolutions

Under the bylaws, any bylaw amendments or resolutions must be presented to the members in writing in advance of the annual meeting scheduled for June 11. The board of directors has charged the Nominating Committee with reviewing and advising the board of any proposed bylaw amendments and resolutions. Therefore, any proposed bylaw amendments and resolutions should be submitted in writing no later than Feb. 12 and/or they can be presented in person at one of the Nominating Committee meetings.

MESSAGE FROM OPERATIONS: Planned cooperative projects

As we look ahead into 2026, Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative is committed to bringing additional reliability and safety to our system. A team of engineers and operation employees from Mor-Gran-Sou Electric have thoughtfully planned to ensure seamless execution of the upcoming projects. These projects include strengthening our system and new services and upgrades.

Strengthening our system

Various substation projects have been diligently planned for 2026 as part of the current work plan. Completing these projects will allow for enhanced electric services for members.


- **North Almont Substation:** Two miles of aged overhead power line will be replaced with two miles of new underground distribution cable. Additionally, new underground cable will be installed west of the North Almont Substation. The 1.25 miles of underground cable will allow three miles of aged overhead power line to be retired.
- **Sioux Substation to Sitting Bull Substation:** Our staking technicians will begin acquiring easements to replace 7.5 miles of aged overhead power lines with 7.5 miles of underground cable.
- **Cannon Substation:** 3.5 miles of single-phase overhead power lines will be replaced with 3.5 miles of two-phase underground cable. Upgrading to two-phase will help expand load access in this area.

- **Plainsview Substation:** Two miles of overhead power line will be replaced with two miles of underground cable. This conversation is being made due to increases in rejected power poles during pole testing.
- **Solen Substation:** Crews began cutting over seven miles of three-phase overhead line in 2025, and we will continue to retire the seven miles of overhead line in 2026.
- **DeVaul Substation:** Five miles of three-phase overhead power lines will be replaced with five miles of three-phase underground cable southwest of the substation.

Additional projects crews will work on this year including pole testing on transmission lines, tree trimming and maintenance throughout the service territory. These initiatives will help us ensure our infrastructure is safe and reliable across our service area.

New services and upgrades

Throughout the year, our crews will continue to plan and install new services as well as service upgrades to meet members' needs. Whether you plan to build a new house, install a grain bin or have other plans that include bringing electric services, be sure to call our office. By contacting us in the early stages of the planning process we can help provide guidance and analyze what your projected electric service requirements may be as well as service availability and potential costs.

We would like to remind members to report outages by calling 800-750-8212. This information helps us assess where the cause of the outage may have originated from. Mor-Gran-Sou Electric continues to focus on the goal of providing safe, efficient, reliable service to our members and look forward to serving you in 2026. 



SAFETY STARTS WITH ME: Winter storm safety

Snow, ice and high winds are often an inevitable part of the winter on the prairie. These conditions can have an impact on our electric infrastructure, which may lead to power outages.

"We know that outages during storms can be unsettling," says Troy Kuball, apprentice lineworker. "But here at Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative, our team is ready and prepared to help get power restored in a


safe and efficient manner."

During uncertain times like power outages, it is important to be prepared and stay safe. Here are some tips to keep in mind before, during and after an outage.

- **Make a storm kit.** Having a few items on hand is better than nothing at all. Include items such as water, nonperishable foods, blankets, a first-aid kit, flashlights and extra batteries. Keep in mind all households may be different and make the kit

applicable to you. Place all items in a storage box, so all the items are in one place for easy access if the power goes out.

- **Report outages.** In the event of an outage, it is important that all outages are reported. This helps cooperative employees understand the issue and send a crew to restore the outage. Report an outage by calling 800-750-8212.
- **Use generators safely.** If you plan to use a portable generator as a power source, be sure the generator is located outside your house for proper ventilation. It is also important to follow the manufacturer's directions for operating the generator.
- **Never approach or touch a downed power line.** Always assume all wires on the ground are electrically charged. Call us to report the downed power line immediately.

Planning for severe storms or other emergencies can reduce stress and anxiety caused by the weather event and can lessen the impact of the storm's effects. Additionally, rest assured knowing Mor-Gran-Sou Electric employees are working as efficiently and safely as they can to restore power to your home.

MOR-GRAN-SOU ELECTRIC BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS Oct. 29

The board of directors meeting of Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative was held on Oct. 29 at the Mandan Service Center. Chair Steve Tomac called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m. A quorum was present. Also present were Mor-Gran-Sou Electric co-General Managers/CEOs Jason Bentz and Travis Kupper, Chief Financial Officer Alex Craigmile, Manager of Operations Gary Fitterer, Chief of Staff/Member Services Manager Julie Armijo, Interim General Counsel Andrew Fergel and Executive Assistant Connie Hill.

Consent agenda: An agenda amendment was proposed. The consent agenda was approved as amended.

Strategic items: Bentz and Kupper presented the co-general managers' report, which included updates on Basin Electric Power Cooperative, Innovative Energy Alliance Cooperative and other items. Several additional Basin Electric reports and board documents were available for review.

Department reports: Craigmile provided a financial report. Fitterer reviewed the operations report, which


detailed the projects currently being handled by line crews, including new service installations and service upgrades. Armijo provided a member services report on 2026 member events and programs. Chief Information Officer Charlie Dunbar provided the board with a written report. Fergel provided a general counsel report on legal topics and projects, such as board policy review.

Action items: Action items were discussed and resolved.

Discussion/general information: The board discussed the preliminary capital budget, capital credits, National Rural Electric Cooperative Association programs and more.

Executive session: The board entered an executive session during the meeting.

The meeting concluded with adjournment. Secretary-Treasurer Pam Geiger certified the accuracy of the minutes.

Next meeting date: The next meeting is at 10 a.m. on Jan. 28 in Mandan.
