# SAFETY STARTS WITH ME: WAYDE ECKROTH

Wayde Eckroth, grew up on his family ranch near Flasher, North Dakota. He enjoys hunting, fishing and the great outdoors. He is also an active member of Mandan and a lineworker for Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative.

One of the things Eckroth likes best about North Dakota, and Mor-Gran-Sou service territory is the natural beauty that surrounds us. "We are fortunate to have so many trees that offer shade and a habitat for all sorts of birds and other wildlife," said Eckroth.

"As a member of the local community, and a lineman at Mor-Gran-Sou, we strive to balance maintaining beautiful surroundings and ensuring a reliable power supply by keeping power lines clear in rights of way," said Eckroth.

Overgrown vegetation and trees pose a risk to power lines. For example, if trees are touching power lines in our members' yards, they can pose grave danger to families. If children can access those trees, they can potentially climb into a danger zone. Electricity can arc, or jump, from a power line to a nearby conductor like a tree.

"First and foremost, we care about our members and put their safety and that of my co-workers and line workers above all else," said Eckroth.



A proactive approach also diminishes the chances of fallen branches or trees during severe weather events that make it more complicated and dangerous for lineworkers to restore power.

Of course, one of the biggest benefits of a smart vegetation management program is reliability. Strategic tree trimming reduces the frequency of downed lines causing power outages.

Members can help by:

• Planting new trees and vegetation away from the power lines and pad mount transformers, avoiding future issues

• Call the co-op if you notice that you have vegetation growing near the power lines.
